Team Strike Zone

Simrad-sponsored team Strike Zone continues winning ways and earns the right to face the East Coast's best shark fishermen.

In the USA, team Strike Zone continued its winning ways, finishing as the top West Coast qualifier in the Shark Hunters East vs. West Tournament Series.

The Simrad sponsored team, consisting of captain Steve Guinlan, Brad Dela Cruz and Josh Hendricks,

caught a 275-lb. mako shark one day and followed up the next day with a 394 pounder in the second of two qualifying events.



Strike Zone, along with four other qualifying West Coast shark teams, will soon head cross country to face the top five East Coast shark teams. With everybody starting over with zero points, there will be one tournament in New Bedford, Massachusetts and one in Marina Del Rey, California. The winning team will be crowned the nation's top shark hunters and will be awarded a new Pro Line center console boat with Mercury outboard power (along with a shot at \$1 million for a world-record fish). The entire exciting event will be made into a television series for Outdoor Life Network (OLN) that will begin airing September 30.

This forthcoming show is a follow-up to 2005's Ultimate Shark Hunter Tournament Series, which quickly became the highest rated program to air on OLN. Team Strike Zone won it all in this West Coast event last year, capping it off by bringing a 736-lb. mako to the docks aboard their relatively tiny 23-foot center console (with an equally diminutive CP33E). For finishing in the top spot, the team took home a larger, faster, more comfortable ride — a new 29 Pro Line Super Sport center console with twin 275-hp Mercury Verado outboards worth more than \$100,000.

Not one to mess with success, the team continued its affiliation with Simrad electronics. The new boat features a perfectly matched package of navigation and fishfinding electronics, including a CX44 display with sounder, radar and plotter, a virtual feedback AP26 autopilot, R86 VHF and the NMMA Innovation Award-winning WR20 RemoteCommander. It also features the Simrad name emblazoned proudly across its sides, so none of the spectators, cameramen or other anglers will have any doubt about which brand of electronics guide these successful anglers.

The added speed and range of this boat together with its full complement of Simrad electronics has helped put team Strike Zone back on top as the 'Best of the West' head off to do battle with the Beasts of the East.
